



Elementary School Clubs (K-5)

- Culture Club: Don't you wonder what time travel would be like? Join Culture Club, and we will "go back" in history to experience how people in past time periods and different parts of the world lived. Students will have the opportunity to share foods and costumes and suggest places and eras they would like to explore. Grades 4-5.
- Elementary Workout Club: Elementary workout club is an excellent way to promote a healthy lifestyle. Join the club for a 30 minute workout and learn how to prepare a healthy snack.
- National Junior Beta Club: National Beta Club's mission is to promote the ideals of academic achievement, character, service, and leadership among students. Grades 4-5.
- Show & Tell Club/Citizenship Club: The Show & Tell Club is a safe space for students to share anything that makes them proud from artwork to awards to pets. Middle School Clubs (6-8)

High School Clubs (9-12)
